## Executive Board Meeting

October 3, 2019

Call to Order: President Steve Fritz called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. and welcomed everyone. Approval of August 8, 2019 Minutes: The minutes were approved as printed.

### Officer Reports:

Treasurer: Lino Wiseman listed the following information in his financial report:

1. The University of Evansville Scholarship Fund is valued at \$45,764.20.
2. ERTA received a check for \$1,849.31 from Frog Follies. Jim Sharp spent \$348.47 to feed our volunteers. The remaining amount of \$1,500.84 will be deposited in the ERTA Special Projects Account.

Then, Lino spoke about the time that Jim Sharp spent at the 4-H Center setting up on Thursday and working at the registration tables on Friday and Saturday. Also, this year his wife prepared many desserts for our volunteers. As a result, Lino proposed that ERTA give the Sharps a \$50 gift card. Diane Meier seconded. The motion passed.

President Elect: Janet Leistner announced that reservations number 116/117 at this time. USI President Dr. Ronald S. Rochon will be the guest speaker.

### Committee Reports:

Fellowship/Necrology: Judy Isaac reported that Donna Lutz is now chair of this committee.

Teacher Locker: Janet Leistner reported that the Teacher Locker will be expanding.

Steve said that volunteers are needed. He added that donations collected at our December luncheon will go to the Teacher Locker.

## ERTA Members Volunteer at Teacher Locker

Teacher Locker, the new teacher supply store, opened on July 25, 2019. Since then, over 200 EVSC teachers have taken advantage of this free resource to help outfit their classrooms and to provide additional curriculum resources for students. To date, teachers have “purchased” over 6,000 items including teacher storage units, desk organizers, classroom furniture, bulletin board supplies and hygiene items. Some of the most popular items have been both copy paper and construction paper, student scissors, mechanical pencils, dry erase boards and dry erase markers and anchor charts.

Each item at Teacher Locker is assigned a point value and teachers are given 40 shopping points. For example, a ream of copy paper is 3 points, mechanical pencils are 1 point for a bundle of ten and a new stapler is 2 points. The stock changes often as we receive donations.

The response from both teachers and the community has been so outstanding that Teacher Locker is already expanding into an adjacent room. This will provide much needed storage for supplies and allow for an easier shopping experience for teachers.

ERTA members have been awesome working as volunteers. Most members have volunteered on Monday mornings from 9:00-12:00 to restack shelves and sort donations. Several ERTA members have worked during teaching shopping hours to welcome teachers and to help direct them to wanted items.

Feedback from teachers has been positive. One teacher wrote, “Christmas in October! Thank you for this wonderful opportunity for FREE! I never get anything free! You are all amazing for setting this up!”
